1.	Syllabus of the question paper for Scientist B and Scientist C.	<ul style="list-style-type: none">• The paper for scientist B and C should be different.• Papers for Scientist B and Scientist C should include 2 sections: <u>Section-A</u> and <u>Section-B</u>.• Section A should include questions on Current affairs / mental ability / general awareness about water resources and environmental issues etc. (30 Marks)• Section B should have questions of the level of graduation (in case of engineering background candidates) and post-graduation level (in case of science students). Further, section B of the paper should contain questions from all the fields / disciplines mentioned in the advertisement. The representation of different disciplines should be judiciously maintained. (70 Marks)• Paper for Scientist C examination should be more advanced and should include questions to gauge the conceptual understanding of hydrology and water resources.
2.	Duration of the question paper.	Two (02) Hours
3.	Total number of questions in the question paper.	Hundred Multiple Choice questions of one (01) mark each. Each question should have only one answer.
4.	Whether, there shall be a provision of negative marking, if so, the marks awarded for wrong answer.	Yes, negative marking is recommended. Following marking system may be followed: <ul style="list-style-type: none">• One mark for each correct answer• (-) 0.25 mark for every wrong answer• (-) 0.25 for multiple answers of any question
5.	Minimum qualifying marks to be obtained by	Minimum qualifying marks for (a) General / OBC candidate = 40%

	candidate to be called for interview.	(b) SC/ST candidate = 30%
6.	Number of candidates to be called against each post based on the merit in the written examination.	In the ratio of 1:6 of the number of posts, i.e., upto a maximum of six candidates from written exam merit list for one post.
7.	Any other point/ criteria that may be deemed appropriate to be recommended by the Committee.	Smart phones / smart watches / calculators / tablets etc. should not be allowed in the examination hall.
